Bursar's Message

"Dear Members,

Please find below my report for the last year. I send sincere thanks to the Committee and in particular the club Captains, PJ and Noelle for their work over a very difficult year for all of us. I know that the Captains make many sacrifices to carry out their duties as diligently as they do during their term of office and it is greatly appreciated. I would also like to thank Sandra and Mark for their help in the administration of the members' information and subs. The online booking system may have brought difficulty to some of you when it started but it is of great benefit to us for contact tracing purposes and for better checking of Green Fees. It has also greatly helped Stewart and his team on to plan some elements of course maintenance in less busy periods.

In the academic year 20-21 under Covid regulations our c350 pupils were not allowed to play any sports matches at all, not train inside and only train outside in restricted pods. This made it very difficult to operate our normal sports programme that runs over 6 afternoons per week. We had more pupils than ever wanting to play golf and some now have professional coaching. This is an area that the College will be looking to develop in the near future with a small number of elite golfers being encouraged to join the school from September 2022 on a programme designed to develop their skills and with golf as their major sport.

Although Covid caused us many difficulties the fact that no-one could travel has seemed to cause a resurgence of interest in the game and currently we have in the region of 335 active Licensees and 61 new people join since July 2020. I would particularly like to thank Judith and Barbara and their team of ladies for the huge amount of time and effort they put into the Get into Golf Programme which has resulted in the fifteen ladies who are now in the Stay into Golf Programme in this year, a fantastic achievement.

We were lucky enough to have a mild winter but the course was exceptionally dry over a long summer period requiring the watering of greens by hand, a very time-consuming job during the busy growing season.

Much work goes on throughout the year to keep the playing surface in its good condition. All the fairways were sanded in the Spring. In order to carry on the work to improve the drainage on the greens 80% of them were scarified early on in the year. Top dressing was completed as part of normal maintenance.

The Jacobsen rough mower that was bought in 2019 proved very problematic and caused much frustration to the green-keeping team as well as to all of you. Despite our efforts to get it fixed properly and produce the quality of cutting required this proved unsatisfactory, so the decision was made to trade it in for a John Deere model. This has proved a good decision and we are confident that there is already a marked improvement in the playing surface.

After comments from the club regarding the copse between the 8th and 9th which had previously been thinned in 2016, our tree surgeon returned in January and removed a further 86 trees, leaving 140 in play. Around the same number was removed from the copse next to the top half of the 9th fairway. In addition, the ditch in front of the Ladies 2nd T box which had caused an unwanted ball trap was tidied up.

We cannot guarantee the constant flow of water down the hill to feed the pond on the bend of the first fairway and in times of relative drought such as now it does not look well. We hope that by making it smaller it and edging it more cleanly it will be more of a feature for longer periods and enable it to be more manageable even in dry conditions.

Covid restrictions prevented us from carrying out anything other than general maintenance on the course but we were able to use the time to replace the decking around the pavilion and install a paved veranda and railings which looks fantastic and has extended the outside seating space for licensees to enjoy.

I extend my thanks to our green-keeping team of Stewart, Joe, Ciara, Roland, Paul and Barry who between them continued to work to keep the course playable over the year. They are all utterly loyal, hard-working and diligent and do their best, day in and day out often in unpleasant conditions. I am very grateful for their ongoing support as I am sure you are all too.

I wish Stephen and Barbara all the best for the upcoming year and look forward to working with them and I wish all of you good health and good golfing. Sally Gibbs, Bursar"

LADIES HONORARY SECRETARY'S REPORT (Patricia Grennan O'Byrne)

ZOOM was our way to hold meetings this year. The 3rd June was a red letter day when we held our first meeting on the club house balcony.

A short historical note, I attended the EGM of the ILGU on Thursday 28th January 2021 on Zoom. The purpose was to vote for the ILGU to cease trading. The vote was 100% in favour of dissolving the ILGU. President Emily attended the inaugural National AGM of Golf Ireland on Saturday 27th February 2021 via online conference. I would like to thank Geoff Brooks, Sue Farrell and Jim O'Dea who remain as Club Children's officers for Golf Ireland. They attended Courses organised by Golf Ireland on having juniors on the course, this is mandatory from Golf Ireland.

The WHS was rolled out in early 2021. Our handicap secretaries had to digest an enormous amount of information on all the adjustments, I sincerely thank them for this work.

We currently have a list of 106 Lady Members, which includes 1 away member and 7 New Members.

<u>I include Judith Hayward's report on the wonderful success that is GIG AND SIGS</u>:

"I am delighted to share that during the 2021 golfing year, KGC welcomed 15 new lady members to its numbers, graduates of the Kilmashogue "Get into Golf" and "Stay in Golf" Programme. I am equally delighted to share that all our GiGs and SiGs ladies have now obtained their WHS handicaps, carry full club members status and report that we have seen quite a number of the new ladies participating and indeed winning some of the Tuesday competitions; a notable mention here of our KGC Ladies Foursomes Match Play Winners this year - Bernie Barry from SiGs and Barbara Kearney.

Due to the ongoing Covid disruption earlier in the year and some considerable pressure on the time sheets in the Spring, the Ladies club decided not to re-run the GiGs programme this year. The programme template for future sessions has been created and can be repeated when the club is ready. Perhaps next time around we will see some of our new members participating again, but this time as volunteers, course walkers and card markers. It goes without saying, the Committee remains grateful to all who supported the programme and gave their time generously. It has been a real pleasure to work with and get to know these ladies over the last 12 months and we look forward to golfing with all of our 2021 new Members for many Seasons to come. Judith."

Men's Hon. Secretary Report (Jim Humphreys)

President Emily, Captains PJ and Noelle, Incoming Captains Stephen and Barbara and fellow members It is my privilege to present the Men's Secretary's report for the year 2020/2021- another very disjointed year thanks to Covid. Closed between January and May club activities were very disrupted. Many traditional events and competitions-Captains dinner, winter league, Christmas lunches, Captains' drive-in etc were casualties. Thanks are, however, due to everyone for maintaining a high level of compliance with Covid protocols.

I want to take this opportunity to acknowledge the hard work of our Captains and their committees but a special word of thanks is due once again to Jim Ellis and Andrew Grehan in particular, and their counterparts in the ladies section for the efficient discharge of an increased workload due to Covid and the bedding down of the WHS system.

On the playing front the club succeeded in playing our major club competitions- the Captains prize, the President's prize, GOY etc. The Captain's away day also took place. The "hole in the wall" competition and Four internal Matchplay competitions were run with a total of some 90 matches played. Thanks to Deirdra Healy for all her work in organising the matchplays.

On the inter-club front the Club fielded teams in the Pearse Purcell with Jack Kearney and Tony Bourke as captains, in the Metropolitan led by Dermot King and Jim Berry, in the All-Ireland Four ball led by Brendan Blake and Dan O'Connor and in Mixed Foursomes led by Barry Jackson and Elaine Healy. Unfortunately, all lost their first- round matches but not without a good fight. The Club, led by Frank King and Vivian O'Rourke, exited the Old Conna seniors against Woodbrook. The Club had very good runs in the Best Cup led by Jim Nix and Brendan Young and the Cullen Cup led by Marc Thornton and Deirdra Healy -getting to the finals in both competitions. Great achievements for a small club. Thanks to all the Captains and the vice-Captains for all their work in organising panels and teams, practice sessions and so on. Thanks to Frank King and Jennifer Moffet for co-ordinating interclub activity. I would strongly recommend to members that they put their names down for club teams in the coming year.

The position in relation to membership is that the men's section now consists of 243 members, with 1 social member plus 8 members on the injured list. Since the last AGM 28 new members have joined and 19 have not renewed their membership. Most of these have retired from golf. We hope they will continue to visit the club and enjoy the odd game as guests. Finally, I want to thank Patricia, Ladies Honorary Secretary and Sandra for their help and cooperation during the year.

Treasurers' Report (Mark Donovan)

On behalf of myself and Suzanne I would like to express thanks and gratitude to Sandra Murtagh for her work and assistance during the year. Her commitment and support were, as ever, invaluable to myself and the club. I would also like I to thank my fellow committee members and wider membership for their support and assistance over the past year. Given the extraordinary circumstances we have all endured over the past 18+ months I am delighted that we are all able to be here in person this evening.

With the added complexity and uncertainty caused by pandemic I endeavour to deliver this report in as a clear and transparent way possible.

As Treasurer, I present the report of the financial affairs of Kilmashogue Golf Club for the year ended 31 August 2020.

The club has produced a surplus of €20,426 for this year. This follows a surplus generated last year of €11,718. The headline drivers for this are due to a large inflow of new members and minimal costs incurred in some expense categories in comparison to a 'normal' year. However, I would like to emphasise the importance for us to "normalise" the compatibility of the accounts and the best way to do this is to compare the statements to 2019 where the club generated a modest surplus of €4,600.

Having said that the club is sitting on increased reserves and our committee have set some projects in motion to use these reserves in order to best serve Kilmashogue Golf Club. Some of these projects and decisions include the reversal of the 40/60 split on competition prizes and competition revenue with immediate effect, installing new club IT systems to help us modernise and streamline our operations and we will also be rolling out new club embroidered clothing via a new supplier. If you have questions on any of above mentioned please feel free to ask me about them.

The committee would also encourage members to contact us with any ideas they might have but we would remind members that we do not own the course and it is difficult to justify any capital expenditure on the course using members money.

Finally, I would like to urge caution on loosening purse strings entirely. It is our duty and priority to first protect the future of the club.

In relation to the Balance Sheet, I have included a breakdown of the Debtors and Prepayments and the Accrued Expenses below for your reference.

If you have any questions on any of the information supplied in the financial statements or in the above report, please feel free to ask questions and I will do my best to answer them.

Kevin Burke queried rise (10%) in insurance cost despite reduced activity, rise (6%) in membership fees but affiliation fees down 28%-should they not move in parallel, and lack of any provision in accounts for fixed assets and whether club had any fixed assets. Mark Donovan attributed rise in insurance to new members and confirmed that no rebate on insurance due to Covid despite request for one. He confirmed that drop in affiliation fees happened due to the amalgamation of Golf Ireland. Historically you have had a renewal date for the GUI and a separate renewal date for the ILGU. When Golf Ireland came into being they set their renewal date – 1st April. This created a gap of a month or two where clubs were not charged for affiliation fees. However, we are yet to see if Golf Ireland look at this in the coming year. In relation to fixed assets Mark explained that the club did not hold any fixed assets at the year- end 31/8/2021. The clubhouse and its fixtures and fittings are owned by the college and the clubs use of it is permitted upon the agreement between the two parties. Any small machines and IT equipment bought by the club in the past were so cheap and/or obtained via donation or second hand thus the amounts were judged to be immaterial to the accounts and were expensed. However, since the year end the club have purchased a laptop for use by the handicap sectaries and this will be capitalised at a cost of €900 and depreciated over the next 5 years. The reason for this purchase is that the new handicap system and master score board can be accessed remotely and therefore secretaries don't have to clog up the office here in the clubhouse.

Vincent O'Kelly queried provision of €32,000 for deferred income, whether College contributes to club admin. Expenses, added features of new IT system and contribution from monthly draw . Mark **Donovan** explained that Deferred income arises due to the difference in club membership renewal dates and the financial year end date. For example, when a member paid his/her €160/€140 in June/July this was for membership from 1st July 2021 – 30th June 2022. In essence the €160/140 paid was for 2 months of the 2020/21 FY and 10 months of the 2021/22 FY. The 10- month proportion becomes deferred income for next year, 2021/22. Mark confirmed that College did not contribute to club admin costs.in relation to proposed IT improvements Mark indicated that club has no IT system in the back office. All work is done manually which creates inaccuracies, extra work loads, mis-information and mis-communication. There are systems such as BRS, Easy-payments, Master Scoreboard, Realex and AIB Merchant Services. While these systems are extremely important to the club the club has no membership management tools or financial management system. For example, we cannot ask on a given day how many members are in the club without a considerable body of work having to be carried out. This causes issues around reconciling the BRS system, providing membership numbers for insurance purposes, providing numbers to Golf Ireland for affiliation purposes etc. The rationale on doing it now is that Club will be looking for a new office administrator and best to update systems in parallel. These systems will also promote consistency and accuracy with the changeover of officers year on year. Mark confirmed that monthly contributed €4485 as per accounts.

The meeting approved the Financial Statements for 2020/2021

Competitions Secretaries Report (Jim Ellis & Ger Coughlan)

President Emily, Lady Captain Noelle, Captain PJ and Members.

In the interests of brevity, we are presenting a joint Competitions Report in respect of both the men's and ladies clubs.

Your Competitions Committee provided Weekend Competitions, Tuesday Competitions, Wednesday Competitions and Bank Holiday Competitions. However, covid restrictions prevented the holding of any social competitions during the summer. Thank you to all our members who have competed in competitions during the year since October 2020. We wish to thank our colleagues Andrew Grehan, Jimmy Fortune, Phil Kelly and Mary Harris, who manage Handicap Masters and Master Scoreboard, for providing results for our 9 holes and 18 holes competitions throughout the year. We would like also to record our thanks to those members who gave their time in assisting to compile results for those competitions that cannot be processed through the Master Scoreboard System. Your involvement enabled a greater variety of competitions to be provided to members! Overall weather conditions were favourable for competitions with just one weekend competition affected by adverse weather and none of the Tuesday & Wednesday competitions were affected. Granted we were not playing golf during the bad winter weather because of Covid. Vouchers to the value of €4,450 were distributed to men prize winners in competitions held up to 2

On the ladies side for the same period, fee income of €5,315 was received with €2,190 being given back in voucher prizes. The Competitions Committee would like to thank Sandra Murtagh for all her admin help and expertise provided throughout the year and previous years.

Thanks to Vice-Captains Barbara and Stephen for their superb organisation of the annual "Hole in the Wall" competition against Stackstown, which was won by Kilmashogue. A great win – well done to all concerned.

I would like to express my thanks to Andrew Grehan for his help during the year always there answer any queries we had.

Mens Handicap Secretary Report (Andrew Grehan)

President, Vice-President, Captains, Vice-Captains, Committee members and fellow members, the following is the Men's Handicap Report for 2021. All figures are per the Golf Ireland statistics of Kilmashogue members as of 20 October 2021:

There are 243 members in the men's category (238 in 2020). 228 men currently hold a handicap (213 in 2020). This is a net increase of 15 players to the Handicap List for the same period last year. In total 13 (2020 -15) initial handicaps were issued to members during the period. There are 15 members without a handicap. These are both new members who have recently joined the club and existing members. There are currently 2 players in the process of obtaining an initial handicap. There are 10 players of which 3 are away members whose handicap is in single figures, with 5.4 being the lowest handicap held by a home player. The following are the number of members in each category:

(0.0 to 9.9) 7 home & 3 away

(10.0 to 19.9) 83 home & 2 away

(20.0 to 29.9) 93 home & 4 away

(30.0 to 39.9) 31 home & 1 away (40.0 to 54.0) 4 home & 0 away.

I again wish to acknowledge and thank sincerely Jimmy Fortune for his practical help and handicap expertise throughout my tenure as Handicap Secretary. Thank you also to Jim Nix for his participation on the Handicap Committee and to Sandra for her ongoing support in the office. It has been a pleasure and rewarding to work with the Committee and with the Ladies Handicap Secretaries Mary Harris and Phil Kelly throughout the period.

I also wish to acknowledge the help and guidance of David Robinson and Geoffrey Brooks with the production of our new scorecards earlier this year. The major handicapping event of the period was the introduction of the World Handicap System for all golf clubs in the country. All golf clubs and memberships have had to adjust to the implementation of the revised handicap index, course and playing handicaps. Thank you to the Captains and to all the membership for their support with this and other initiatives I wish my successor the best of luck as he takes up his new role as Handicap Secretary.

Tony Burke asked about Handicap setting. **Andrew Grehan** confirmed that there were no new directives from Golf Ireland with regards to issuing Handicaps and taking history of applicants into consideration when issuing Handicaps. Andrew also indicated that Golf Ireland had just issued instructions on the Annual Review process and that all handicaps including initial handicaps would be considered as part of that review.

KGC Course Update (John Westman)

First like to thank you, the members, for your cooperation and forbearance during the Course disruptions and closures, most arising from the Covid 19 mandatory restrictions. Also want to thank you for your ongoing assistance with repairing pitch marks, replacing and/or putting sand into any divots, smoothly raking the bunkers and using a Golf Tee at all boxes.

The 2021 Course report is brief. Presuming you are regularly playing the fairways and admiring the view from the new patio - you will no doubt agree - that generally the Course is in nice condition.

The members wish to thank the Grounds Superintendent Stuart and his team, for their work in maintaining the Course and for their ongoing attention to the greens, which has delivered a steady improvement in the condition of the KGC greens.

As you know, the Captains and Joint Committee are the forum for member's feedback on issues that interfere with your golf game ...for example ...Why is there a difficulty locating your golf ball is it due to excess grass growth in the ditches or under the pylons ...? or because the hedges or shrubbery are encroaching on the Fairways? ... or the ponds are not regularly cleared?

8. Motions

Motion No.1

Currently one has to play three 18 qualifying rounds in the previous 12 months to be eligible to win for a given major competition (e.g. the Captains Prize). This motion proposes to change that to also allow six 9 hole qualifying rounds in the previous 12 months to be eligible to win a given major competition. Given the club is a 9 hole club and also some people cannot play 18 hole golf much at weekends (due to personal or work reasons), this seems a fair motion for change given the reason for the rule is to ensure major competition entrants have not been protecting their handicap by not playing in qualifying rounds of golf.

Proposed: Pearse McCarthy Seconded: Gerry Gr.ehan

In the absence of Pearse McCarthy (Proposer) **Gerry Grehan** presented the motion to the AGM. A number of members (including **Jack Kearney, Tony Egan**,) spoke against the motion noting, inter alia, that prior to Covid the requirement was for four 18 hole competitions.

A number of members (**Kevin Burke, Mary Gough**) indicated support/sympathy for the motion on the basis that changing circumstances including profile of players , need to promote participatition etc pointed to need for change.

On a show of hands the motion was rejected.

Motion No 2.

Proposal to change the indexes on the 9hole cards from 18-hole indexes to 9-hole indexes. Why? As a 9 hole course a lot of competitions are played over 9 holes. The present 18hole indexes on the 9 hole card is confusing especially for newer members. The change can easily be done at the next printing of 9 hole cards. **Proposed**:Gerry Grehan **Seconded**:GerardineGrehan

Gerry Grehan presented the motion to the AGM . **Andrew Grehan** , in response, outlined the extensive consideration given to the proposal earlier in the year by the Joint Committee which decided not to adopt the 1-9 indexes on the basis that it would conflict with computer software, give rise to need for new and additional marker posts and itself cause confusion due to differing indexes on 9 and 18 hole cards. Other members (including **Barbara Kearney**, **Marc Thornton**, **Tony Bourke**) also spoke against the motion on similar grounds. In response to Marc Thornton's query about the position of the JC in relation to the 1-9 indexes and whether a counter-motion was considered Jim Humphreys confirmed that JC were opposed to motion and that counter-motion considered but not proceeded with. In light of the discussion **Gerry Grehan** withdrew the motion **9.AOB**

Noelle Kennedy confirmed she had received correspondence from a lady member, about competitions and she would pass this email on to incoming committee for attention.

In response to queries from **Tony Bourke**, **Mark Donovan** confirmed that club subs. are paid in one lump sum.

Elaine Healy asked that the guidelines for the nomination of Presidents of KGC be reviewed by the Incoming Committee and that a secret ballot be used.
